### **UPDATES ON THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATION IN MALAYSIA**

#### **Current Status of Confirmed COVID-19 Cases Who Have Recovered**

14 June 2020 – The Ministry of Health (MOH) would like to inform that **35 cases** have fully recovered and discharged well today. **Cumulatively, 7,346 confirmed COVID-19 cases have fully recovered and discharged well** (86.9% of total cumulative cases).

#### **Current Situation of COVID-19 in Malaysia**

14 June 2020, 12 pm – A total of **eight (8) additional confirmed COVID-19 cases** were reported to the National Crisis Preparedness and Response Centre (CPRC) MOH today. Cumulatively there are now **8,453 confirmed COVID-19 cases** in Malaysia. Therefore, there are **currently 986 active and infective COVID-19 cases**. They have all been isolated and given treatment.

Of the eight (8) additional cases reported today, **two (2) are imported cases** who were infected overseas, involving non-Malaysian permanent residents. Of the **six (6) local transmission cases**, four (4) cases are non-Malaysians, and two (2) cases are among Malaysians.

All four (4) local transmission cases among non-Malaysians are from the Construction Site 2 Cluster in Kuala Lumpur.

The details of the COVID-19 local transmission case among Malaysians (2 cases) are as follows:

- Sawarak – 1 case: From Influenza Like Illness (ILI) clinical surveillance in Sibu.
- Melaka – 1 case: Screening in a senior care centre, Melaka Tengah

Currently, four (4) confirmed COVID-19 cases are receiving treatment in intensive care units (ICUs), and no patient is on ventilation support.

Regretfully, **one (1) additional COVID-19 death** was reported to the National CPRC MOH today. Cumulatively, there are now **121 COVID-19 deaths** in Malaysia (1.43% of total cumulative cases):

1. **Death #121:** Case 7,468 is a 67 year-old man Indian national who was a detainee at the Bukit Jalil Immigration Detention Centre. He had a history of diabetes, hypertension, heart disease and kidney disease. He was found unconscious at the Detention Centre and was immediately brought by ambulance to Canselor Tuanku Muhriz Hospital, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia. He was pronounced dead on 12 June 2020. He tested positive for COVID-19 and the results of the post-mortem is currently underway.

MOH conveys condolences to his family members.

### **World Blood Donor Day Celebration, 14 June 2020**

World Blood Donor Day is celebrated worldwide on 14 June every year. It is a very important day for blood donors, blood donation campaign organisers, and all of us. The role of blood donors and blood donation campaign organisers is immense. Through their contribution many human lives have been saved.

On average, 2,000 bags of blood donated by Malaysians are used to help about 1,000 patients daily. MOH is very proud and grateful to all Malaysians who donate and contribute to blood donation activities.

Please continue with the good work. MOH also welcomes the public to continue donating blood and organising blood donation campaigns. With this in mind and on behalf of MOH, I would like to wish Happy World Blood

Donor Day to all blood donors and blood donation campaign organisers across the country.

### **Health Advisory on COVID-19**

The general public is also reminded to always follow the health advisories repeatedly mentioned by the MOH, that includes:

- Avoid the **3Cs**: **C**rowded places; **C**onfined spaces; and **C**lose conversations
- Practice the **3Ws**: **W**ash hands frequently with water and soap; **W**earing facemasks is strongly encouraged in public areas or if symptomatic; **W**arn self and others for the following, in line with MOH's advisories:
  - Avoid shaking hands or touching others
  - Practice good coughing and sneezing etiquette
  - Seek early treatment if symptomatic
  - Stay at home and avoid from visiting others
  - Regularly clean and disinfect commonly touched surfaces in common areas

In addition to the SOPs, continue to adhere to **THIS**:

- **T**: Terms set under the Recovery Movement Control Order (RMCO)
- **Hi**: High-risk groups such as children, infants, older adults and the disabled must be protected, and if unwell with symptoms, to seek early treatment
- **S**: Safe social distancing is practiced at all times, of at least 1 metre away from others

MOH will continue to monitor the development of the COVID-19 situation, both in the country as well as internationally, based on available information from the World Health Organization (WHO). The public will be continuously updated on the latest information. In addition, MOH will ensure that appropriate preventive and control measures are continuously implemented.
